LONG BEFORE DECEMBER 1943 THERE HAD BEEN RUMORS THAT THE 332ND FTR. GR. WAS DESTINED TO SOON DEPART FOR OVERSEAS DUTY. DURING THE MONTH OF DEC. THOSE RUMORS PROVED TO BE WELL FOUNDED. INSPECTIONS OCCURRED DAY AFTER DAY UNTIL ALL EQUIPMENT FOR FOREIGN SERVICE HAD BEEN ISSUED. WHEN THAT WAS COMPLETED ALL CONCIEVED THAT IT WAS ONLY A MATTER OF DAYS OR HOURS WHEN LT. CLEED WOULD TELL US "THIS IS IT". THAT TIME ARRIVED ON DEC. 20, 43 BUT PROVED TO BE A DRY RUN. BUT ON DEC. 22, 43 THE 332ND DEPARTED SELFRIDGE FIELD, MICH. FOR "DESTINATION UNKNOWN". THERE WAS ON THE NIGHT OF DEPARTURE THE USUAL BAND MUSIC, AND IN ADDITION THE 332ND WAS AWARDED A PROFICIENCY MEDAL BY THE POSTO COMMANDER WHICH WAS AN INCENTIVE FOR ALL MEN OF THE SQDN. TO CONTINUE THE EXCELLENT PERFORMANCES OF THE PAST, WHEREVER THEY MIGHT BE SENT IN THE SERVICE OF THEIR COUNTRY.

ON THE MORNING OF DEC. 25, 43 THE SQDN. ARRIVED AT CAMP PATRICK HENRY, HAMPTON ROADS PORT OF EMBARKATION AREA. THIS WAS INDEED A STRANGE CHRISTMAS MORNING FOR THE MEN OF THE SQDN. THERE WAS VERY LITTLE TALKING DURING THE HOLIDAY SEASON BUT I AM SURE THAT THE THOUGHTS OF EVERY MAN OF THE SQDN. WERE WITH THOSE THEY WERE LEAVING BEHIND.

AFTER MORE OF THE SAME TYPE OF INSPECTION PREVIOUSLY ENCOUNTERED THE SQDN. WAS PRONOUNCED READY FOR THE GREAT ADVENTURE. ON THE MORNING OF JAN. 3, 44 THE SQDN. BOARDED THE TRAIN FOR THE FINAL RIDE TO THE PORT OF EMBARKATION. THE MOOD OF THE MEN WAS HIGH AND THERE WAS LITTLE OUTWARD EVIDENCE OF THE EMOTIONS WHICH MUST HAVE BEEN MINGLING IN THE HEARTS AND MINDS OF THE MEN. THE SQDN. BOARDED THE LIBERTY SHIP T.B. ROBINSON AND ON THE AFTERNOON OF JAN. 4, 44 THE VOYAGE BEGAN. THERE WAS SOON PROUD THAT WE WERE PART OF A LARGE CONVOY WHICH QUIETED THE FEARS OF MANY OF THE MEN.



THE TIME ON BOARD SHIP WAS PLEASANTLY SPENT. THERE WAS SOME TYPE OF LECTURE OR ENTERTAINMENT ALMOST EVERY NITE. THE SPECIAL SERVICE UNDER THE DIRECTION OF SECOND LT. LUDWIG SMITH WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF FIRST LT. JOHN R. BEVERLY, SGT. ROBERT HALL AND PVT. SAMUEL CHAMBERS MADE NOBLE EFFORTS TO SUPPLY EVERY RECREATIONAL AND SPIRITUAL NEED OF THE MEN. AFTER A COMPARATIVELY INEVTUL VOYAGE, THE SHIP DISEMBARKED AT TARANTO, ITALY ON THE 29TH OF JAN. '44. AFTER SPENDING ABOUT TEN DAYS AT THE STAGING AREA AT TARANTO, THE SHIP WAS MOVED ON FEB. 7, '44 BY MOTOR TRANSPORT ACROSS THE MOUNTAINS OF ITALY TO MONTICOVINO AIR BASE, MONTICOVINO, ITALY. CAMP WAS QUICKLY SET UP AND THE QDN. AGAIN PROCEEDED TO FUNARDO AS IT HAD BEFORE LEAVING THE STATES. THE REMAINDER OF THE MONTH OF FEB. WAS SPENT IN COMPLETING THE TRAINING OF WHICH THE QDN. WAS FINALLY ACTIVATED.
